09.00–10.30 | 20-year jubilee with previous winners of the WIN WIN Award

The first part of the conference focuses on 20 years of the award – how it started and how it has developed, and the role an award can play for pushing issues ahead. There will be two panels, as well as previous award winners giving us a glimpse of their work.

11.00–12.30 | Lectures and workshop with food experts Christel Cederberg and Artur Granstedt

The second part of the conference aims to lift the issue of food waste into a bigger picture and to deepen our understanding of what the transition to a sustainable food system means. In two separate lectures Artur Granstedt, associated professor at Södertörns Högskola, and Christel Cederberg, doctor in environmental science and adjunct professor at Chalmers University, will share their own experiences and perspectives on the topic.

The lectures are followed up by a workshop where the participants will work interactively to get a better understanding of how to advance the transition to a sustainable food system – and how certain examples can help us to get a broader and more nuanced picture of the solutions needed.

We then continue by revealing the winner of WIN WIN Gothenburg Sustainability Youth Award. The winners will receive their prize and make a short presentation of the winning project idea.

Following, this year's award winner, Arash Derambarsh, will receive the WIN WIN Gothenburg Sustainability Award for his persistent work and an unfaltering commitment to reducing food waste in France. After the prize-giving there will be a panel discussion where the issue of food waste will be addressed.

The award ceremony will end with a music act performed by Jeanine Tesori and Dick Scanlan.
